Dear Crop and Livestock Producers and Manure Applicators:

A Dry Manure Application Field Day will be held near Clarion on Tuesday, August 16, 2005. (Rain date is August 19). The field day will start at 12:00 noon with a free lunch followed by presentations from DNR on land application of dry manure, stockpiling and manure management plans; NRCS on Comprehensive Nutrient Management Plan, technical assistance and cost-share funds, and with IDALS on sales of dry manure.

ISU Extension Specialists will demonstrate field activities on how to sample manure, rainfall simulation for runoff management, and dry manure application using spreaders to check uniformity and distribution of application. Displays will be available for viewing. A detailed program agenda is included in this brochure.

Commercial and Confinement Site Manure Applicators can obtain the necessary hours (up to three) of required training for initial certification, renewal or continuing education for the Manure Applicator Certification Program. 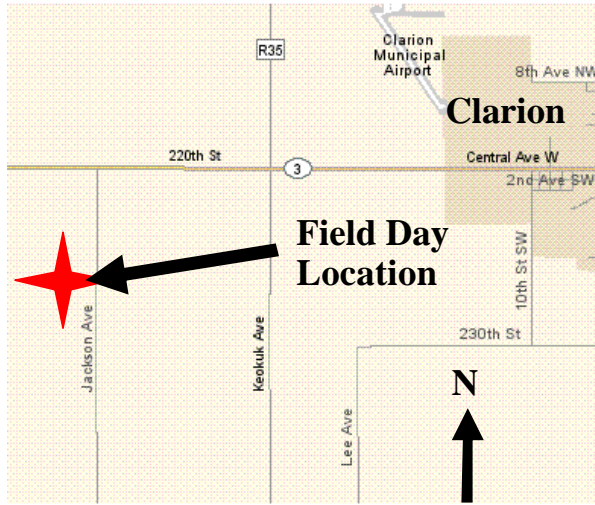
